

Virat Kohli is a famous face in the Indian cricket team, who has achieved many heights in the game of cricket from his early days till the present time. Virat Kohli is a very famous cricket player. He belongs to the Punjabi community. Virat Kohli was born on the 5th of 1988 in a middle-class Punjabi family in Delhi.

His father was Prem Kohli who was a renowned lawyer. Virat Kohli's mother's name is Saroj Kohli. Virat Kohli's elder brother's name is Vikas Kohli and his elder sister's name is Bhavana. According to Virat Kohli's family members, when Virat was three years old, he took a cricket bat in his hand and asked his father Prem Kohli to bowl, which was a sign of Virat's bright future.

Virat Kohli's early education was from Vishal Bharti Public School, Delhi. When the Delhi Cricket Academy was built in the West Delhi area in 1988, when he was just nine years old, his father, with the advice of his neighbors, got Virat Kohli admitted to the Delhi Cricket Academy. Virat Kohli's father Prem Kohli as well as his neighbors had assessed Virat Kohli's cricket talent

Prem Kohli's neighbors said that Virat Kohli should not waste his time in street cricket but should take professional cricket training in some academy. In this way the future cricket path of Virat Kohli became easy. Virat Kohli learned the nuances of cricket under the leadership of Rajkumar Sharma and practiced while playing cricket matches at Sumit Dogra Academy.

Virat Kohli was admitted to Saviour's Convent School for his class 9 education. There, along with education, assistance was also provided in cricket training. Apart from playing cricket, Virat Kohli was also a brilliant student in education. Virat's teachers also considered him a promising student. Gradually, Virat Kohli's cricket game continued to flourish. Virat Kohli was made a member of the Delhi Under-17 team to play the Vijay Merchant Trophy in the year 2004.

Virat Kohli had contributed more than 450 runs in this four-match series and in one match, Virat Kohli had scored an unbeaten 251 runs. Due to his impressive performance, he was again selected for the Vijay Merchant Trophy the next year, in which Virat Kohli made the record of scoring the most runs by scoring 757 runs in 7 matches.

In the Vijay Merchant Trophy, Virat Kohli scored two centuries and scored runs at an average of 84.11. In July 2006, Virat Kohli got the opportunity to tour abroad for the first time as an Under-19 player to play cricket in England. In his first tour to England, Virat Kohli had contributed 105 runs in three ODIs.

It was during this period in England that Virat Kohli scored runs at an average of 49 in three Test matches in which he won the 2006 ODI and Test series. In the year 2006 itself, Virat Kohli had performed very well against Pakistan Under-19 team. After assessing Virat's talent, he was made a permanent member of Under-19 cricket.

That day was very unfortunate when Prem Kohli died due to brain stroke on 18 December 2006. The shadow of his father was lifted from Virat Kohli's head, describing which Virat Kohli has said, I have seen a lot in my life, my father left me in his young days. The financial condition of the family was shaken and we had to live in a rented room, which was no less than a terrible shock.

After the death of his father, Virat Kohli came into limelight when he was playing in the match against Karnataka in Delhi. Under 19 cricket was organized in Malaysia in 2008 when Virat Kohli was leading the India Under 19 cricket team. Batting at number four in that match, Kohli managed to score 335 runs in 6 matches at an average of 47.

Virat Kohli was praised for making strategic bowling changes throughout the tournament which shows his leadership abilities. Virat Kohli leads every match with seriousness. Played an important role in India's victory in the 2009 Emerging Players Tournament held in Australia. In the final match against South Africa, Virat Kohli scored a century with his bat in which India won by 17 runs.

Seeing the brilliant talent of Virat Kohli, after Dhoni's retirement from Test matches in the year 2014, Virat Kohli was given the command of the Indian Test team. The greatness of Virat Kohli's cricket game is evident from the fact that he has set the record of scoring the fastest 5000 runs in an ODI cricket game. Virat Kohli has the credit of being the first player to score more than 1000 runs in ODI matches in four years.

Virat Kohli also has the credit for scoring the fastest 1000 runs in a T-20 match in the year 2015. Virat Kohli has received many awards. He was awarded the ICC Award in the year 2012. O. Was chosen D.I. Player of the Year. Apart from being a middle-order batsman, Virat Kohli is also known for his right-arm medium pace bowling. Virat Kohli represents the Delhi cricket team in first-class cricket and is the captain of Royal Challengers Bangalore in the famous Indian Premier League (IPL).

He has also played cricket for Delhi Cricket Academy in his cricket career. Virat Kohli also holds the record for scoring the fastest century as an Indian batsman. Virat Kohli started his One Day International cricket career in 2008 and was an important member of the Indian team that won the World Cup in 2011. Despite playing ODI cricket regularly, Virat Kohli played his first Test match against West Indies in Kingston in the year 2011.

He was awarded the ICC Award in the year 2012. Was selected for player. Virat Kohli was ranked as the top batsman in ODI matches for the first time in the year 2013. Recalling his struggling days, Virat Kohli said that after the death of his father, the financial condition of the family became very weak due to which we had to take shelter in a rented house along with our family members.

In the year 2006, when the news of Virat Kohli's father's death was received, Virat Kohli was leading the Delhi team against Karnataka for the Ranji Trophy, but Virat Kohli preferred to complete the game and then left for his home. It is enough to show strong will.
